### SOLUTION

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- 1. C: Mode is the value with the highest frequency. Thus, y = 5
  - To get the median, we arrange the data in order, we then identify the middle value (the median)

The numbers in ascending order are:

Then 
$$x = 5$$

$$So_{,}(x,y) = (5,5)$$

2. A: Let the cost of price be x

Amount Olu sold it = 10% of x + x

(Since a profit of 10% was male)

$$= 0.1x + 1 = 1.1x$$

Amount Ade sold it = 1.1x - 5% of 1.1x (Since Ade incurred a loss of 5%)

$$= 1.1x - 0.055x = 1.045x$$

Since the actual amount Ade sold was 209, we have:

$$1.045x = #209$$

$$x = \frac{#209}{1.045} = #200$$

3. C: Method 1

### Method 2

We can convert each value to its decimal equivalent, perform the operation in decimal and then return the result to base 3

$$212_3 = 2 \times 3^2 + 1 \times 3^1 + 2 \times 3^0 = 23_{ten}$$

$$121_3 = 1 \times 3^2 + 2 \times 3^1 + 1 \times 3^0 = 16_{ten}$$

210

$$222_3 = 2 \times 3^2 + 2 \times 3^1 + 2 \times 3^0 = 26_{ten}$$

Then, we have  $212_3 - 121_3 + 222_3 = 23_{ten} = 23_{ten} -$ 

$$16_{ten} + 26_{ten} = 33_{ten}$$

We now convert 33<sub>ten</sub> to base 3

Thus,  $212_3 - 121_3 + 222_3 = 1020_{ten}$ 

4. **D:** Let each side of the square be x

Then, length of the rectangle = x + 20% of x

$$x + 0.2x = 1.2x$$

Breadth of the rectangle = x - 20% of x

$$= x - 0.2x = 0.8x$$

Area of square =  $x^2$ 

Area of the rectangle =  $1.2x \times 0.8x = 0.96x^2$ 

$$\frac{Area\ of\ rectangle}{Area\ of\ square} = \frac{0.96x^2}{x^2} = 0.96$$

$$=\frac{96}{100}=\frac{24}{25}$$

Thus,  $A_{rectnagle}$ :  $A_{sqaure} = 24:25$ 

- 5. **B**:  $\log_{10} 45 = \log_{10} \left(\frac{9}{2}\right)$ 
  - $= \log_{10} 9 \log_{10} 2$
  - $= \log_{10} 3^2 \log 2$
  - $= 2 \log_{10} 3 \log 2$
  - = 2(0.4771) 0.3010 = 0.6532
- 6. **D:** sum of the interior angles of a polygon with n sides =  $(n-2)180^{\circ}$

For a pentagon, n = 5. Then,

$$Sum = (5-2)180^0 = 3 \times 180^0 = 540^0$$

Let the fifth angle be y

$$90 - x + 90 + x - 110 - 2x + y = 540$$

$$400 + y = 540$$

$$y = (540 - 400)^0 = 140^0$$

7. **D**: 
$$a:b = 5:8$$
 and  $x:y = 25:16$ . Then,

$$\frac{a}{b} = \frac{5}{8}; 8a = 5b \dots (i)$$

$$\frac{x}{y} = \frac{25}{16}; 16x = 25y \dots (ii)$$

divide (i) by (ii)

$$\frac{8a}{16x} = \frac{5b}{25y}$$

$$\left(\frac{8}{16}\right)\binom{a}{x} = \left(\frac{5}{25}\right)\binom{b}{y}$$

$$\frac{a}{x} \div \frac{b}{y} = \frac{5}{25} \div \frac{8}{16}$$

$$= \frac{1}{5} \div \frac{1}{2} = \frac{1}{5} \times \frac{2}{1} = \frac{2}{5}$$

$$T_4 = a + 3d$$
 (since  $T_n = a + (n-1)d$ )

$$19 = -8 + 3d$$

$$3d = 19 + 8 = 27, d = \frac{27}{3} = 9$$

$$m = T_2 = a + d = -8 + 9 = 1$$

$$n = T_3 = a + 2d = -8 + 2(9) = 10$$

Then, (m, n) = (1,10)

$$8 - 8r = 2r, 8 = 10r, r = \frac{8}{10} = \frac{4}{5}$$

$$\alpha = 2r = 2\left(\frac{4}{5}\right) = \frac{8}{5}$$

$$S_n = \frac{\alpha(1-r^n)}{1-r}$$



Then, 
$$\frac{dV}{dR} = 3 \times \frac{2}{3}\pi R^2 = 2\pi R^2$$


